Accident

- Secure** the hazard area
- Call the emergency services ☎(0)144
- First Aid**

- Stop any bleeding, turn the victim on their side if unconscious
- If unconscious and if breathing is not normal:
 - C: Heart massage (circulation)
 - A: Open the airways (airways)
 - B: Respiration (breathing)
 - D: Defibrillation

Fire

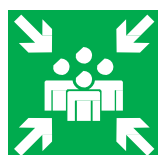
- Call the **fire brigade** ☎3333
- Take endangered persons with you to a **safe place**
- Close** all windows and doors
- Brief the fire brigade, **extinguish** the fire



Evacuation

- Notify endangered persons** and take them with you
- Leave the building using the **stairs**
- Make your way to the **Assembly Point**

Assembly Point: As decided on-site by the fire brigade
